**General Education & Elective Course Examples**

- Open Electives:** Most 100 – 400 level courses may be used. Courses already assigned to fulfill another general education requirement may not be used. Math courses lower than M118 or English Composition lower than W131 will not count. Electives may be from any department as long as they are 100 level courses or higher.
- Arts & Humanities:** Architecture, Art Appreciation, Ethics, Film Studies, Literature, Music Appreciation, Philosophy, Museum Studies, Philanthropy, Theatre Appreciation

**Statistics**

- **Statistics:** Ivy Tech MATH 200 or Walden STAT 3001P or transfer from previous college

### Eligibility for Admission to the Walden RN to BSN Dual Enrollment Pathway (with Accelerate Into MSN option)

- Ivy Tech students may apply and be admitted to Walden’s RN to BSN dual enrollment pathway (with Accelerate into MSN option) during the second semester of Ivy Tech’s ASN program.
  - Students will have a Walden enrollment advisor throughout the enrollment process.
  - An academic advisor will guide students through program and degree requirements after enrollment.
- After being admitted, students can take Walden courses in the order listed as long as pre-requisites are met.
- Students may take Walden’s required general education courses at any time while enrolled in the Ivy Tech ASN program or while enrolled Walden’s RN to BSN program.

### Transfer of Credits to Walden University

- Upon admission to the Walden RN to BSN dual enrollment pathway, students may submit college transcripts for pre-evaluation of general education courses for transfer credit.
- Prior to enrollment in Walden upper division nursing courses, students must request that **official transcripts** be sent from Ivy Tech and any other colleges/universities to Walden’s Baltimore office (650 S. Exeter Street; Baltimore, MD 21211) to receive transfer credit for ASN and general education courses.
- Credits for transfer will only be accepted if completed at a regionally accredited college or university.
- Student must submit proof of current, unencumbered RN licensure to be fully admitted into Walden’s RN to BSN program and become eligible to enroll in Walden 4000-level nursing courses. <http://www.in.gov/pla/nursing.htm>

### Policies and Student Information

- **Remaining general education requirements must be completed before the end of the program except STATs, which is required for Walden’s NURS 3150.**
- In all Walden coursework, students must earn a grade of C or above. A grade of “C” or above must be obtained by the third attempt.
- Additional details about student policies and information is available at <http://catalog.waldenu.edu/>. Select “Student Handbook” from drop down menu.
- Students must maintain an active, unencumbered RN license through the end of the Walden BSN program.
- Students must maintain a 2.0 or better GPA (from the degree granting institution).
- Walden requires 45 of the last 90 quarter credits earned for a bachelor’s degree be earned at Walden University. Transfer of credit is subject to change based on curriculum updates by academic leadership.

### FAQs

- Walden courses are offered every 6 or 12 weeks and are fully online.
- All Walden faculty are licensed RNs and have doctorate degrees.
- If students maintain continuous enrollment, they can complete the Walden’s Nursing courses within a year. Electives completed may decrease time in the program. See Walden course map below for details.
- 5000-level graduate courses in this BSN program will accelerate progress in MSN program and reduce the MSN time to completion by 1.5 quarters.
